

Origins of the word TAUTUK

Proto-Inupik: *tautuy-, *tauttu

Meaning: to look 1, to see sth. 2

Russian meaning: смотреть 1, видеть 2

North Alaskan Inupik: tautuk- 2, tauttuᖅ

NAI Dialects: B, Ingl tautuktoq* 2, Mal tautuk- 'to focus on'

WCI Dialects: Cor, M tautuktoq* 2, Cop tautuk- 'to have seen' [Met.], Net tautuk- 'to catch sight of' [Ras.], EP tautuqūq 'vision'

Eastern Canadian Inupik: tautuk-

ECI Dialects: Lab- tautuk- 'to be able to see' [Bourq.]

Greenlandic Inupik: tātuy- 'to receive a distinct impression from s.o.'s appearance', tautugpa^* 'to see' [Jen.], tāttu (tauto*) 'appearance'
